From the Superintendent

Happy New Year to all our administrators, scientists, friends and supporters! I hope your 2020 has started off well after enjoying a joyous and restful holiday break. All of us here at SIRP certainly enjoyed our break. And, like the entire Bulldog Nation, we were thrilled with the results of this year's victory in the Sugar Bowl over Baylor. We all look forward to the 2020 football season with many new faces/names to learn! Go Dawgs!

Looking back over December, the Park received 8.79 inches of rain over 10 events, with a 2.93 inch gully-washer event on the 22nd. Our high temps ranged from 78.5F to 49.7F and lows came in from 68.2F to a chilly 28.1F. (As I write this, highs for next few days will run 77F to 82F!) For the year, we received **51.73 inches of rain** - essentially our long term average amount – over 98 rainy days. For all of 2019, our average max temp was 78.8F and our min temp was 55F. You may recall that in 2018 we received a whopping 73.8 inches of rain. We've provided graphs on the next page illustrating 2019's temps, rainfall and ET.

Like many of you, many of us are now in the report writing, proposal writing, and meeting attending time of year. Our local Mitchell County Extension office is hosting a number of farmer-oriented production meetings and there will be larger corn, cotton, and peanut meetings in Tifton later this month. Make plans to attend meetings in your county and/or the meetings in Tifton.

The SIRP crew has been busy with winter maintenance on our equipment, doing some checks and tweaks of VRI zone definitions related to research plots in one of our linear-move system fields, applying lime, and have been fertilizing rye cover crop for Dr. George Vellidis.

In early December, I traveled out to Las Vegas to attend the '19 Irrigation Association "Irrigation Show and Education Week". I took the "Introduction to Irrigation: Agriculture" class while there. Very informative. I then headed up to Athens to attend a 2-day meeting of the superintendents of UGA's seven research and education centers around the state. Strategic planning was the main emphasis at the meeting. We enjoyed dinner with several of CAES' department heads. My next meeting was on Dec 6 in Albany with extension agents, consultants and colleagues from CAES and the Flint River Soil & Water Conservation District. We had an end of year wrap-up meeting related to the SW GA AgWET project.

We enjoyed a Christmas lunch here with the Mitchell County Extension office (Brian, Debra, and Sylvia) and the staff with the Flint River Soil & Water Conservation District (Perri, Casey, Judy, Lindsay, Fredando, Ken and Vanessa). It was nice to have a great crowd.

Speaking of visitors, I'm pleased to report that we have **903** folks visit Stripling Park in 2019! This included our friend Marty Saylor with Lindsay Irrigation. Marty is working to get our Lindsay Zimmatic linear-move system upgraded to work with their FleldNet system.





2019 Weather Data






Daily Cumulative Rainfall


