From the Superintendent

As I look back over February here at the Park, it's obvious the weather was on the variable side. We had 6.65 inches of rain in 7 events during the month with one event of 3.39 inches. The high temps ranged from 58F to 84F and the low temps ranged from 64F to 30F.

The SIRP staff was busy during the month spraying, fertilizing and irrigating Dr. Coolong's Vidalia onion plots. We sprayed burn-down herbicides on Dr. Vellidis' corn plot area under the "Newton" lateral. We disked and deep turned some of our field areas and ran the roto-tiller through some of last years' peanut plots to bury the hay. We also wrapped up the install of our Telone application hardware to our new strip-till implement. Dr. Vellidis and his technician John installed runoff flumes in the bermed plots in the corn area to quantify any irrigation and/or rainfall runoff.

We contracted with a local vendor to run their skid-steer mounted mulching tool through one of our pine areas to remove volunteer underbrush. This will allow us to run our rotary mower through the area in the future. The site looks much better now.

We were pleased that our local Valley Irrigation dealer, J&B Irrigation, worked with us to get an ICON10 panel for our Valley 4-tower center pivot. This smart panel along with an integrated AgSense unit will give us enhanced remote access and control options for this pivot.

Our friends with USGS worked it out to install sensors and a data recorder to do continuous monitoring of static water tables in the Floridan aquifer and Claiborne aquifer monitoring wells at the Park. We'll have the data live soon.

I was pleased to be invited over to the South Carolina Soil & Water Conservation Society annual meeting in Columbia. I did a presentation on dynamic VRI. I enjoyed visiting with several old friends – Phil Bauer, Ken Stone and Matt Smith. (BTW – it's a long haul from SW GA to Columbia and back in a day.)

As most of you know, crops will be planted soon – which means irrigation is just around the corner. As you fire up your irrigation system this year, be sure to check out our UGA Extension publication – "Spring Center Pivot and Lateral Irrigation System Preparation." You can find it at this link:








